# Research Society's Profile

# Core Values



The basis of knowledge is to “Question our Experience”. Wisdom brings in freedom and fearlessness. The meaning of complete education is that the learners who get complete knowledge can give direction to society. They can bring in revolution within the society in a more meaningful manner.

**Devotional Yoga:** The word “yoga” comes from the Sanskrit root ‘Yuj’ which means to link up with or combine. In doing loving service to the Supreme by means of devotional services include the practice of conscious action, philosophical study, and contemplation.
